

# HB 39: Yazzie Lawsuit Educational Funding

✔ Pass HB 39 to strengthen the K-12 pathway & invest targeted funding in key initiatives at NM's colleges & universities.

These initiatives help prepare our next generation of teachers, school administrators and instructional support providers; develop school curricula and professional development; they create bilingual and Native language programs; and support schools, districts, and tribal communities to meet students' health and social services needs.
